The educational philosophy of the Norris School District is built on the following principles:

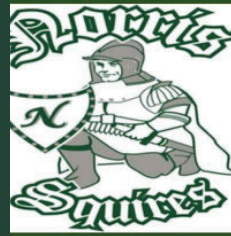

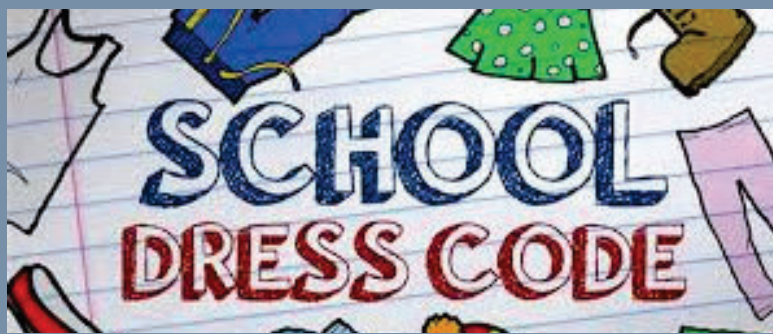

The board recognizes that proper student attire is an important part of an effective school environment. Student dress should reflect the importance of school and help create a climate conducive to student achievement.

The primary responsibility for student dress lies with the student's family. We have confidence in and are appreciative of parental support for the school's efforts to maintain appropriate standards for student dress.

Prohibited Dress:

- Flip-flop sandals or shoes without heel straps, slides, slippers, metal-tip boots, or shoes with grinders/wheels.
- Halter tops, backless dresses, bare midriff styles, spaghetti straps, or strapless or revealing tops.
- Any style hat or headwear other than those listed below shall not be worn.
- Student dress which advertises, promotes, depicts, or supports drugs, alcohol, or tobacco, or products containing these substances are not permitted.

A Must-Read Before You Do Any Back-to-School Shopping

- Footwear with a back strap shall be worn at all times and shall not be removed.
- All tops shall have a minimum 2" shoulder strap. A bare midriff may not be visible when arms are stretched upward and no exposed undergarments.
- Shorts must have a minimum of a 5" inseam or be mid-thigh and/or bottom of hem at the fingertips when hands are at sides. Skirt and dress length must be long enough to fully participate in PE without restrictions.
- Pants, shorts, and skirts may not have holes above the 5" inseam or allowable length as stated above. Skin MAY NOT be showing, even through "shredding" above the 5" inseam or allowable length as stated above.
- Pants, shorts, and skirts shall be worn at the waist and no exposed undergarments.
- Hats designed for sun and cold protection, i.e., wide, full-brim style or beanies are allowed during outside activity only.
- Clothing with hoods is permitted; however, students may not wear the hood inside buildings.



Ensuring Student Safety

In the Norris School District, your child's safety is our top priority. We know that for students to thrive academically and socially, they must feel secure at school. Here are some of the key measures we are taking to maintain a safe and supportive environment for all students:

At arrival and dismissal, staff members are stationed at school gates and parking lots to help ensure students transition safely. Thank you for continuing to drive slowly, remain alert, and avoid distractions such as phone use while in school parking areas.

To further enhance campus safety, Norris School District will continue to ensure that all front office doors remain locked during the school day. Visitors will be asked to use the doorbell to request entry before being admitted by office staff. Once inside, **all visitors and volunteers will continue to follow the district's established check-in procedures by presenting valid identification and signing in through the Raptor Visitor Management System.** The Raptor system scans visitors' IDs and checks them against the national database of registered sex offenders, providing an additional layer of security that helps us monitor and verify all individuals entering our campuses. These procedures remain in effect throughout the entire instructional day, including student arrival and dismissal times. While student drop-off and pick-up procedures will remain unchanged, all adult visitors must enter through the main office during school hours.

We encourage parents and guardians to visit and volunteer on our campuses and appreciate our families' continued partnership as we take proactive steps to maintain a safe learning environment for students and staff. Unauthorized individuals will not be permitted on campus. For more information about the Raptor Visitor Management System, please visit our website at www.k12.ca.us.

Please make sure to complete and return your child's emergency card as soon as possible so we have up-to-date contact and medical information in case of an emergency.

All Norris teachers are trained to respond to emergency situations, including the unlikely event of violence on campus. Thank you for reinforcing with your child the importance of following directions quickly and calmly during emergency procedures.

Our schools also conduct monthly safety drills covering fire, earthquake, and lockdown procedures. For more information on lockdown protocols, please see the "Lockdown/Shelter-in-Place FAQ" on our district website. You can help by encouraging your child to take all drills seriously and follow instructions carefully.

Each campus is equipped with an automated external defibrillator (AED), epinephrine pen and naloxone. Key staff members are trained to respond immediately in the event of a medical emergency.

We look forward to a safe, secure, and productive 2026–2027 school year. Thank you for partnering with us to keep our schools safe.

School Entry Requirements

Students entering school must show proof of state-mandated immunizations: In addition, children entering TK or kindergarten are required to have documentation of varicella (chicken pox) immunity. This proof can be provided to the school in two forms: a) documentation of the immunization card by the MD's office where the immunization was given or b) a signed written statement from a licensed MD or Doctor's Office in CA, which states that the child had a diagnosed case of varicella. Students entering or retained in the 7th Grade are required to have the T-dap Booster and a second MMR.

NORRIS SCHOOL DISTRICT BREAKFAST AND LUNCH INFORMATION FOR 2026-27

We are pleased to inform you that the Norris School District will be implementing a new option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2026-2027 School Year. One free breakfast and one free lunch per school day is available to all enrolled students, at no charge, regardless of income or need.

Who can get free meals?

All enrolled students.

When does this start and where are the free meals available?

Breakfast and lunch are available every day beginning the first day of school, Thursday, August 13, 2026.

Breakfast is available before the morning bell. Lunch will be available during your student's designated lunch time. Please see your student's school site bell schedule.

Only one free breakfast and one free lunch per enrolled student.

Special Meal Accommodations:

Students who require a meal accommodation due to a food allergy, medical need, or disability must submit a Medical Statement for Meal Accommodations signed by a licensed healthcare professional. A meal accommodation may take approximately two weeks to implement depending on the complexity of the required diet. We do not make accommodations based on personal preference or religious convictions. If you have any further questions, please contact the Director of Nutrition Services at 661-387-7000.

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

Our 3rd through 8th grade students participated in the statewide assessments in English-Language Arts and Mathematics administered through the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC). Our 5th and 8th grade students also completed the California Science Test (CAST).

The digital and adaptive CAASPP assessments were administered over the course of three weeks. The results of the SBAC tests will be used to identify the individual mastery level of each student on the Common Core State Standards as well as to highlight instructional focus areas for the upcoming school year. They will also be utilized to calculate performance levels that will be reflected on the California School Dashboard. The CAST measures student acquisition of the California Next Generation Science Standards and the ELPAC, Administered to English Learners, measures student acquisition on the English Language Development Standards.

Student Score Reports can be accessed electronically through the PowerSchool parent portal which will be available to parents after August 13th. Directions for creating a parent portal account and accessing the student score report can be found on the technology help page on the district website (www.norris.k12.ca.us) under the "For Parents" link in the "RESOURCES" drop-down menu. To learn more about your child's scores, go to the parent web page called Starting Smarter, available at ca.startingsmarter.org.

Bus Schedule Information

Assistant Director of MOT, Melissa Martin, notes that again this year we will only transport students within each school's attendance area. For example, if you live in the Olive Drive Elementary attendance area, but have an intra-district transfer to attend Bimat Elementary, the District will not provide bus service. Transportation to and from school will be, as it has always been with intra-district and inter-district transfers, a parental responsibility. Changes may have been made, so please review the online bus stop locations and times for the 2026-2027 school year. Parents are reminded to have their children at the bus stop five minutes prior to the listed pickup times. Mrs. Martin reminds us that after a couple of weeks, some changes in the bus stop locations and times may be made to accommodate school bus load counts. Most afternoon bus stop locations will be the same as the morning stops. Also, please be patient during the first few weeks of school as the bus may be running late due to adjustments in routes.

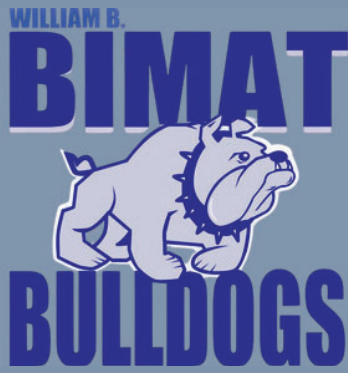
